At the heart of the University of Washington's Master of Education in Instructional Leadership (MIL) degree is the belief that schools need innovative teacher leaders who can nurture and sustain professional peer learning and instructional improvement through dialogue, investigation, reflection and action. Whether you work in a preschool, elementary, middle or high school setting, this cohort-based program will give you the skills and experience necessary to become a dynamic teacher leader.

CAPSTONE INQUIRY PROJECT

As a culminating project, MIL students propose and carry out a focused inquiry project based on a problem or issue of instructional leadership practice in their school or district. A written report and public presentation of the Capstone Inquiry Project provides evidence of mastery of core MIL concepts, as well as ideas, theories and practices from other strands of the program.

EQUITY-DRIVEN, STANDARDS-BASED CURRICULUM

The curriculum — a blend of teacher leadership coursework, content-specific coursework and inquiry-focused leadership practice — is built around the 2011 National Standards for Teacher Leadership. Course structure and content draws on the rich knowledge of UW College of Education faculty, who lead a school ranked in the top 10 nationally in curriculum and instruction education by *U.S. News & World Report*.

The hybrid-online Master in Instructional Leadership program is designed with working professionals in mind. Online and evening courses offer convenience and flexibility during the busy school year. Personalized advisement allows you to craft a schedule that meets your needs.

ROLES FILLED BY TEACHER LEADERS

The MIL program prepares teachers for current and emerging nonsupervisory positions in instructional teacher leadership within their school or district. Some of these positions include:

- Instructional coach (literacy, math, etc.)
- Curriculum specialist
- · Data coach or assessment coordinator
- Professional development coordinator
- · Grade-level or department leader
- New teacher mentor.
- · Early childhood program director
- Professional learning community leader
- Inquiry cycle facilitator

Note: UW's MIL program is designed for education professionals who do not currently aspire to become administrators, although some course credits are transferable to principal preparation programs.
