EDUCATION, COMMUNITIES AND ORGANIZATIONS ELECTIVE COURSE CHOICES (25 credits)

The electives in the ECO major are meant to reflect the interest areas of the student. Many College of Education course may count toward elective credits from the following areas of study: Early Childhood & Family Studies (ECFS), Education (EDUC), Educational Curriculum & Instruction (EDC&I), Educational Psychology (EDPSY), Special Education (EDSPE), Educational Leadership & Policy Studies (EDLPS). **See DARS for approved electives.**

The department may approve a maximum of 5 credits to satisfy ECO electives from volunteer/service-learning/field experience coursework (e.g. mentoring, GEN ST, Pipeline, Dream Project, Jumpstart) **OR** from an *education-related* study abroad. Study abroad credits require departmental approval.

**No more than 5 credits of field experience AND/OR study abroad courses may be applied to ECO electives
